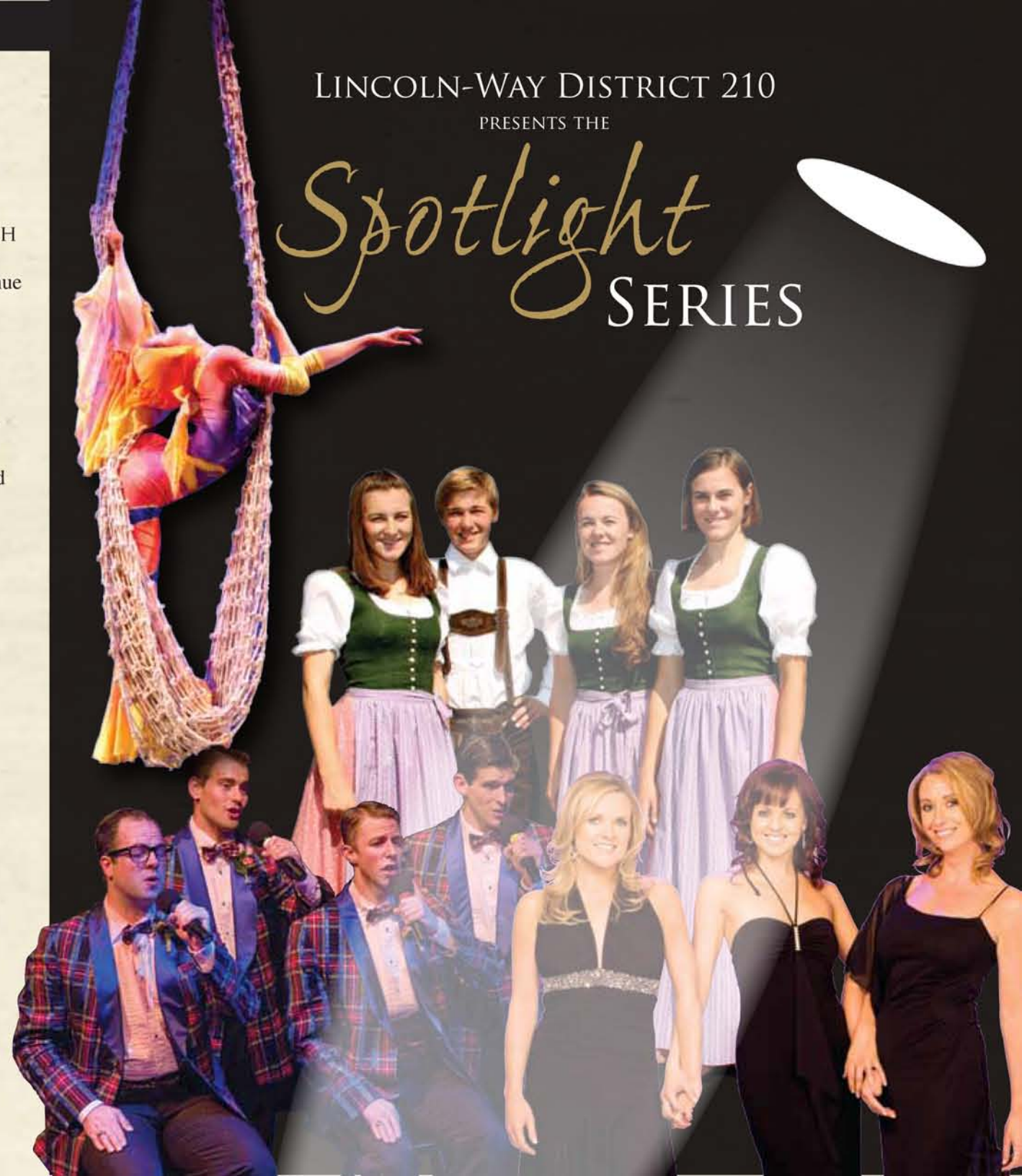

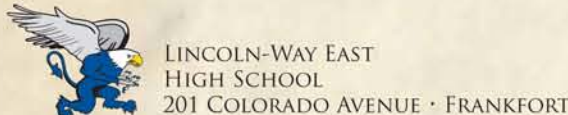

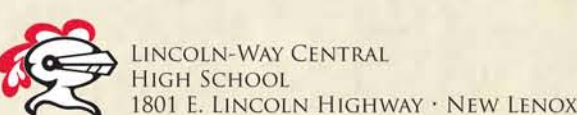
FOREVER PLAID

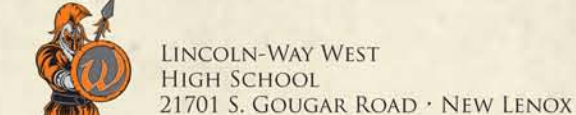
THE NEW SHANGHAI CIRCUS
